## FIVE YEARS OF OFF Where We Come From, Where We Stand

Off University came into being as a response to an emergency: In 2015/2016, thousands of Turkish academics signed a declaration demanding the end of bombardments and human rights abuses by the Turkish army in Kurdish populated areas, and the resumption of the peace process in the region. Most of the signatories were summarily dismissed from their positions, banned from employment in public service, put on trial. Many ended up in exile. Off University was set up by and for them.

At the same time, Off University is rooted in a vision of a university that is different from what exists in Europe or Turkey: A university that takes responsibility for peace and human rights, that is egalitarian in its structure and democratic in its decision-making, that is free of charge for students and open to everyone. Such a university would concentrate on academic work beyond disciplinary borders; eschew participation in oligopolistic publication set-ups and rejects funding by military stakeholders. It would adhere to the highest standards of quality in research and teaching, and a code of conduct that creates save spaces for free debate.

We may still be far from this vision. But it has spurred us on to set up a charitable association with a very light-touch and open structure of decision making. Long before Covid, we began offering online courses accredited by (predominantly) German universities led by scholars at risk. We are a pioneer in distance learning pedagogies. Our bespoke platform is a safe space. At-risk scholars are paid to continue teaching while course participation is free and open to all from anywhere in the world. Many courses are co-taught in a trans-disciplinary manner; our programme balances academic and activist approaches, experts and newcomers.

From our beginnings as an organisation supporting scholars from Turkey, we've expanded to work with 200 academics from 14 countries, including Syria, Ukraine and Afghanistan. We've hosted 7 fellows, including artists and human rights lawyers; run close to 70 courses for over 4,000 participants; run 5 research projects, some with major university partners and international initiatives like the New University in Exile Consortium. We focus on gender studies, critical peace studies and rethinking the university.

In all this, we've maintained our own agency, staid true to our aims in the work we do. We've learned a lot and have a wide network of partners. We've gained recognition and respect. These are no small achievements in an environment of academic precariousness, short-termism, diminishing funds and increasing difficulties for critical scholarship. But there is much to be done still. Off University seeks new strategies to uphold and sustain academic life and knowledge threatened by anti-democratic and authoritarian regimes, aimed at academics from all over the world; academics who have been purged from their institutions, forced to resign, legally and politically persecuted and even imprisoned because of their opinions and research.

Since 2017, we have offered 70 online and hybrid courses, provided financial relief and opportunities for teaching and research for 207 threatened scholars from 14 countries, and collaborated with many German universities and NGOs, forming a virtual network.

Our long-term vision is the creation of a Peace University that combines in-class and digital educational settings.

# Collaborations



#### AKADEMISCHE NETZWERK OSTEUROPA e.V. (AKNO) We started a collaboration with this network to support scholars at risk from Eastern Europe, hosting four online courses with

scholars from Ukraine. Russia and Belarus in the 2022 Winter Semester



#### **BEYOND SOCIAL COHESION: GLOBAL REPERTOIRES OF LIVING TOGETHER - REPLITO**

Off University is a central non-university project partner in RePLITO, which is funded via the Berlin University Alliance. As part of the project, we have developed an digital archive that fosters research and scientific collaboration with tools of collaborative writing and publishing.

#### NEW UNIVERSITY IN EXILE CONSORTIUM

The New University in Exile Concortium at the New School in New York is a worldwide network of universities committed to host endangered scholars, which has been an important partner and supporter. Together we have organized dozens of online seminars taught in tandem by two Consortium scholars in tandem and hosted at our partner universities in Europe. In 2022, the NUiEC co-sponsored two online courses.



#### ELISABETH-SELBERT-INITIATIVE

The Martin-Roth Initiative (MRI) and Elisabeth-Selbert-Initiative (ESI) brings host institutions and threatened individuals together for a temporary relocation. While MRI focuses on artists and cultural managers at risk ESI's fellowship is designed for human rights defenders. With their financial support, Through ESI funding, we hosted a human rights defender in 2023 for 6 months in Berlin and our MRI fellow was with us until March 2023.





#### **INSAF INDIA**

International Solidarity for Academic Freedom in India (InSAF India) is a diverse group of diasporic Indians located in different parts of the world. InSAF India aims to highlight the increasing assaults on academic freedom in India, in particular the attacks on anti-caste academics and scholars from minority backgrounds. We organised a number of webinars on academic freedom with InSAF.



#### OPEN SOCIETY UNIVERSITY NETWORK

Two at-risk scholars from our network participated in the collective syllabus creation of the Transnational Feminism, Solidarity and Social Justice network course. In this collaboration students and faculty from these institutions engage in rigorous academic work, inspire each other through artistic practice, and work closely with local and international initiatives to further the feminist agenda for social justice.

#### ROSA LUXEMBURG STIFTUNG

RLS funds our ongoing Critical Peace Studies in Turkey project. In 2022-23, we organized an online lab on the non-human aspects of War and established a podcast and a blog series on the Gendered Aspects of War and Peace



#### THREATENED SCHOLARS INTEGRATION INITIATIVE

Off-University acted as one of the host institutions for scholars of the Threatened Scholars' Integration Initiative (TSI) by the Open Society University Network. They support scholars who lost their academic positions or could not remain in their home countries. In 2022/23 we offered two residential and three non-residential fellowships.



The residency has provided me with an excellent opportunity to rest and pursue my interests. The Off University team assisted me at every stage, from relocation to planning my time here. It was nice to be in a welcoming environment with people who understand your needs.

Off University started exploring the intersection of arts and academia in 2019 with the Reflection Series. This new direction led us to host a fellow who is active in the arts and culture sector. In collaboration with the Martin-Roth Initiative, Off University is able to invite cultural workers, artists and scholars at risk to Berlin and offer them some time to regain strength, to rest and to think.

# Visual Storytelling as Resistance

*Zahra Gardi* participated in the workshop *Visual Storytelling as Resistance* that we organised with **Mozaik** and **RePLITO** on Lesvos Island from 18 to 30 November 2021.

She is a photographer and video-maker now based in Berlin. Her early short films centred on gender inequality and challenges faced by children at risk in her home country of Afghanistan. Between 2018 and 2022, she was part of video collectives *Refocus* and *Kino Wish* on Lesvos Island and in Athens, and produced videos dealing with different aspects of migration. Zahra was also part of the team that produced the *1000 Dreams* photography series, which has been widely published in National Geographic. Here is what she says about her encounter with Off University:



### **VISUAL STORYTELLING** AS RESISTANCE




- I think it's a good opportunity for people like me who lost their chance to finish their studies because of different reasons like migration, poverty, etc. At least we can update or exchange our ideas and we don't feel hopeless."

# **Multilingual Dictionary**

Off University is part of the research collaboration "Beyond Social Cohesion: Global Repertoires of Living Together (RePLITO) that explores practices of coexistence in a consortium of departments at Berlin's Humboldt University (HU) and Freie University (FU). As a result of the hybrid courses and workshops we did with refugee scholars, artists and activists on Lesvos island, some participants started to collect the words, utterance and speech acts used in the refugee camp on the island. They document both the hardship, but also the strength to resist and to live together despite all the odds experienced by the community of refugees. This resulted in a "Multilingual Dictionary" that was first presented on Mother Tongue Day 2022 at the **Department of Gender and Media Studies of the South Asian Region** at HU Berlin.

As we understood that the words used where partly common in other refugee camps across Europe we launched the dictionary again as a **Wikibooks** to allow for community additions and interaction.

### SELECTED WORDS FROM THE MULTILINGUAL DICTIONARY

#### Ali Baba

A story about a man who is like a Robin Hood.

- Common in the Arabic world, he's stealing for giving to others.
- In the camp when you lose something, or something is stolen from you, you say it's "Ali Baba". For example, a person goes to the police and says "My telephone is Ali Baba" and the police will understand.

#### Çabuk Çabuk

• The expression means "fast fast" and is known by different populations of the camp as they were factory workers in Turkey before coming to Levbos. This expression was used by bosses in order to make them work faster in Turkey.

#### Khalas / Tamam

- "Khalas" in Farsi and "Tamam" in Turkish have the same meaning: "okay", "it's finished".
- They're mostly used when someone gets positive news after their interview. Examples: "Moria khalas", "Moria tamam".

#### Malaka

• One of the most common expressions in the Greek language used at the same time as a form of insult and a way of showing affection.

### My friend

• Inside the camp when you want to say something to someone, it doesn't matter that you know that person or not. You call everybody "my friend".

#### **Stop Pushbacks**

- A slogan used by different communities in the camp and across Lesvbos in the last two years.
- Migrants, activists and NGO workers use this slogan to demand that the Greek Coast Guard and Frontex stop pushing people who are looking for a safe space.

The festival closed with TSII scholar Nevra Akdemir's thought- provoking Kitchen Project.







On Sunday, July 23, 2023, Gubad Ibadoghlu, our internal auditor at the time, was arrested on counterfeiting charges under Article 204.3.1 of the Azerbaijani Criminal Code. Ibadoğlu, a respected economist and political activist, has been wrongfully detained since his arrest. The charges involve cash that the police allegedly found in his office. Despite his poor health, he was subjected to atrocious conditions during his detention. After 274 days, Gubad Ibadoghlu was moved to house arrest, but is still deprived of his liberty and not allowed to leave Azerbaijan to receive the necessary medical care.

We call on the Government of Azerbaijan to drop all charges against Gubad Ibadoghlu immediately, to release him and to stop using criminal persecution to intimidate government critics.
